Welcome Kate Kroell!






Congratulations to the first set of TEFCA QHINs!

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Member Interest Request – HRSA RFP

Comprehensive Systems Integration for Adolescent and Young Adult Health (HRSA-23-079)

- 1) Establish a cross-sector alliance comprised of nationally recognized partners in health, school, and community systems that will collectively provide national leadership;
- 2) Support the alliance to develop and disseminate a national blueprint to improve adolescent health and well-being through systems integration in states, territories, and tribal organizations;
- 3) Provide targeted technical assistance (TA) to learning collaboratives comprised of leadership teams in states, territories, and/or tribal organizations working to implement cross-sector systems integration models;
- 4) Deliver TA to support Title V agencies that have selected performance measures related to improving adolescent health and/or behavioral health; and
- 5) Increase the number of state, territory, and tribal organizations accessing and implementing systems integration models to improve youth health and well-being.

Measure Applications Partnership (MAP) Update


The Measure Applications Partnership (MAP) is a publicprivate partnership convened by The National Quality Forum (NQF)

- In partnership with the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS)
- Designed to provide input to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) on the selection of performance measures for public reporting and performance-based payment programs



MAP's pre-rulemaking work is conducted by:

- The Rural Health Advisory group
- The Health Equity Advisory Group
- The Clinician Workgroup
- The Hospital Workgroup
- The Post-Acute Care/Long-Term Care (PAC/LTC) Workgroup
- The Coordinating Committee



Civitas members participate in several of these workgroups and advisory groups, and Civitas holds a voting seat on the Coordinating Committee.



The Coordinating Committee met for 2 days in January 2023

- The Workgroups and Advisory groups recommend one of four actions on each Measure Under Consideration (MUC):
 - Support for Rulemaking
 - Conditional Support for Rulemaking
 - Do Not Support for Rulemaking with Potential for Mitigation
 - Do Not Support for Rulemaking
- The Coordinating Committee then votes (yes/no) whether to adopt the Workgroup's recommendation
- These recommendations are all provided to CMS, who makes the final decision



The Coordinating Committee reviewed 52 measures under consideration for 17 federal quality programs

- More than twice as many as were reviewed last year
 - Cost Measures
 - COVID19 Measures
 - Cross-Setting Discharge Function Score Measures
 - Geriatric Measure
 - Volume Measures
 - Patient Activation Measure
 - Social Determinants and Disparities Measures
 - Safety Measures
 - Rural Emergency Hospital Quality Reporting Program Measures
 - Measures pulled from Consent Calendar



General Themes

- Many measures lacking endorsement received conditional support for rulemaking, pending review and endorsement by a consensus-based entity
- Concerns were raised about all COVID vaccination measures, specifically not wanting to penalize providers in areas with high community vaccine hesitancy
- Concerns were raised about all cost measures and the role of primary care provider vs specialists in controlling costs



General Themes

- Questions around process to ensure measures aren't duplicative
- Cross setting measures received strong support (e.g facility volume in inpatient, ambulatory surgery center)
- Patient activation measure received strong support, though programspecific use was questioned
- Robust and largely supportive discussion and public testimony on Social Determinants and Disparities Measures



Social Need Measures Pulled from Consent Calendar

- MUC2022-098: Connection to Community Service Provider (MIPS)
- MUC2022-111: Resolution of At Least 1 Health-Related Social Need (MIPS)
- Both measures received strong support from public testimony
- Both measures pulled because of outstanding concerns on lack of reliability, use of social needs screening tools that have not been standardized, and the role of insurance
- Coordinating Committee ultimately voted to support the Work Group recommendations, "Support for Rulemaking," on both measures with nearly unanimous support



All Cause Risk Measures Pulled from Consent Calendar

- MUC2022-055: Hybrid Hospital-Wide All-Cause Risk Standardized Readmission Measure (Hospital IQR)
- MUC2022-057: Hybrid Hospital-Wide All-Cause Risk Standardized Mortality Measure (Hospital IQR)
- Both measures pulled because the measure specification changed significantly after work group recommendations, including Medicare Advantage patients
- Coordinating Committee was ultimately not concerned about this change and voted "Conditional Support for Rulemaking," pending endorsement by a consensus-based entity, on both measures with nearly unanimous support



Geriatrics Measure Pulled from the Consent Calendar

- MUC2022-112: Geriatrics Hospital Measure (Hospital IQR)
 - Measure pulled due to concern about duplication with MUC2022-032: Geriatrics Surgical Measure (Hospital IQR)
 - The Coordinating Committee did not reach consensus on workgroup recommendation so had to vote again
 - Ultimately voted "Conditional Support" pending endorsement by a consensusbased entity, further work on paring down the elements included in the attestation and presenting information about gaps for the components covered by the measure
