

Government Relations Update: ONC Health Data, Technology, and Interoperability Proposed Rule

- Proposes updates to the information blocking regulations that are intended to advance interoperability, improve transparency, and support the access, exchange, and use of electronic health information (EHI). The proposed changes **include updates to the Information Blocking Exceptions**.
- Civitas drafted and submitted a comment letter to ONC on June 20 with support and signatures from our member organizations.

The Stewards of Change Institute (SOCI) is a nonprofit organization started in 2005 with the purpose of improving the futures of the most under-resourced and under-served populations – by initiating, inspiring and advancing transformational change in health and human services systems at all levels of government, industry and nonprofits.

- Three-part webinar event series highlighting white paper findings and recommendations, and kicking-off next steps to improve this work in the state




Objectives for our White Paper

Stewards Focuses on Data Sharing Between HIPAA and Non-HIPAA Entities for Whole Person Care




- People generally must navigate multiple domains, systems and programs to acquire critical services and supports.
- Secure, responsible and accurate information exchange is crucial for decision making, treatment, oversight and knowledge management.
- New mind sets, models, tools and competencies are needed to work effectively across silos.
- Informed Consent (Utility) is needed to enable and streamline data sharing for whole-person care.

Why Focus on Consent in California?

- California data sharing initiatives underway hinge on the ability of state agencies, private organizations to understand and manage for privacy and confidentiality laws and local policies across sectors
 - California Data Exchange Framework and Digital Identities Strategy
 - CalAIM 1115 waiver program
 - CalAIM ASCMI consent pilots (see next slide)
- State government focus on equity as a grounding principle
- Housing and substance use issues are of particular concern given their persistence and impact across the state requiring inter-agency collaboration, and data sharing

Background on Medi-Cal ASCMI pilots

- California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) (CA Medicaid Agency) selected three organizations to participate in the Authorization to Share Confidential Medi-Cal Information (ASCMI) pilot
- ASCMI consent form created as a model data sharing authorization form to support Medi-Cal's Enhanced Care Management and Community Supports initiatives that include health and social services organizations
- Primary applicants needed to be HIEs/CIEs, with county agencies (including behavioral health), and Medi-Cal Managed Care Plans and their contracted providers
- Project runs through August 2023
- Organizations and partners include
 - 2-1-1 San Diego, with San Diego County, Health Net, county health and human services agency, partner CBOs
 - Serving Communities Health Information Organization, with Santa Cruz County Health and Human Services Agency, Central California Alliance for Health, partner CBOs
 - Manifest MedEx, with San Joaquin County Health and Human Services, Health Plan of San Joaquin, Health Net, partner CBOs
